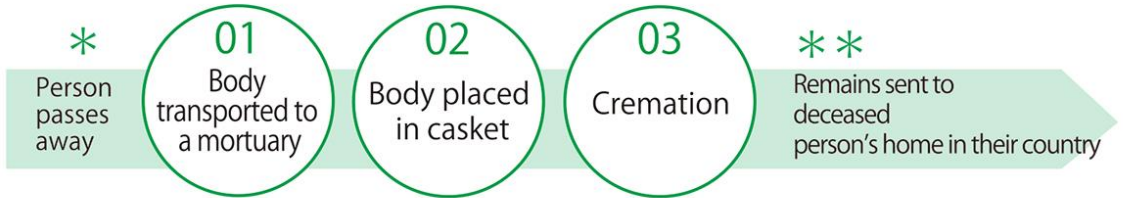

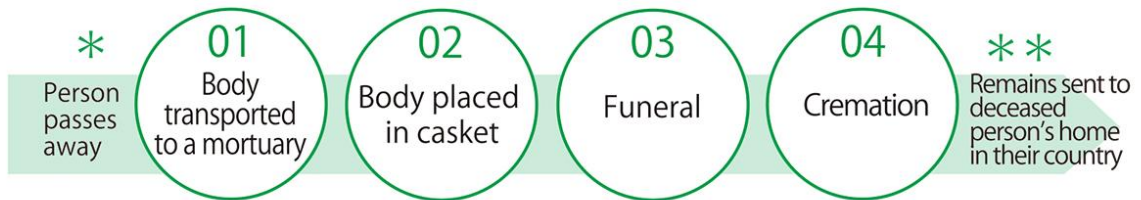

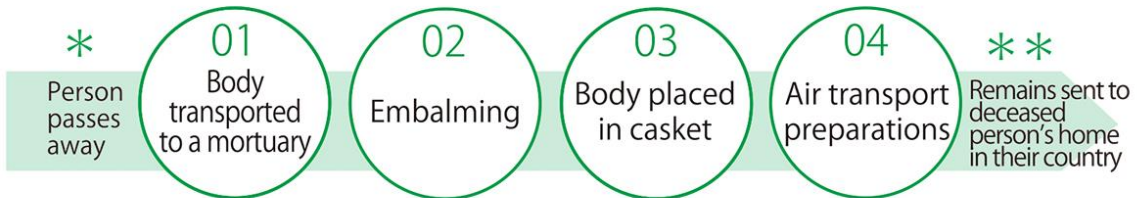

Case 3: Returning the body to the home country of the deceased

If the deceased was in Japan temporarily for sightseeing or business.
If you choose to have the funeral and burial in the home country of the deceased.

Main Steps

Required documents

Overseas air transport of body: main documents

Family (concerned parties): Passport of deceased, Information regarding
local destination (address, name of local funeral parlor, etc.)

Hospital: Death certificate (Japanese and English)

Teitotenrei: Certificate of corpse (Japanese and English),
Packing certificate (Japanese and English),
Certificate of preservation of body (Japanese and English), others

Q.Is service available at night?

A.Teitotenrei's staff provides service 24 hours per day, 365 days per year.

Q.The person passed away at a distant location.

A.You can rest assured that we will handle the necessary arrangements for a vehicle to transport the body.

Q.How do I pay for the costs?

A.Once you have confirmed the details in the bill, you must pay by credit card or cash. If you request only a cremation, you must pay the full amount at the time of cremation. If you choose to have the body air transported overseas, you must pay the full amount before the body leaves Japan. If you have requested funeral services, you must make a partial payment of the estimated amount in advance, then pay the balance after confirming the total amount due after the funeral services.

Q.Can we discuss the costs in advance?

A.We will provide you with an estimate after talking with you in advance about your needs. If you have any worries, please contact us.

Q.We want to hold the funeral services in accordance with the religious and other customs in our own country.

A.Teitotenrei's funeral services halls can accommodate various religions (Buddhist, Christian, etc.). However, please understand that there might be limitations regarding the facilities.

Q.What is embalming?

A.Embalming is a procedure by which the blood and other bodily fluids are replaced with a special preservative solution so that the body can be kept at normal temperature for an extended period of time. When the body is transported overseas by air, embalming is required from the standpoint of safety and hygiene.

Q.Can you refer us to a burial site in Japan?

A.We can refer you to a cemetery, charnel house, jumokuso (burial in which a tree is planted instead of erecting a tombstone) or a provider that scatters ashes at sea. We do not handle burials.

Q.What does your overseas air transport service entail?

A.● Embalming of the corpse (see above).

Arranging for a funeral parlor in the home country.

● Preparing and submitting the documents specified by the embassy.

● Reserving a flight and taking care of the customs formalities .
(the body is treated as cargo)

● Special package for air transport purposes, transporting the body to the cargo terminal on the day of departure.

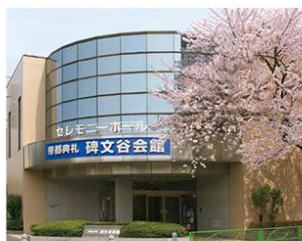
